Our nation's healthcare system – already caring for 40 million seniors today – will be extremely overburdened by 2030, when it is projected that the number of seniors will nearly double. This, coupled with healthcare reform and a shrinking number of care providers, requires more efficient solutions for the delivery of care to seniors.

President's Message

Last month we had a great program lead by Bobby Williams of Emdeon, previously known as WebMD. Bobby gave a great overview of Leadership and a brief review of Business Continuity which he is involved with at Emdeon.

About 50% of medical transactions go through Emdeon's data centers. Over 1400 insurance carriers are represented, this traffic represents hospital information and claims, pharmacy claims and patient personal information. Clearly this data needs to not only secure but available at all times. This is an enormous responsibility and Bobby leads a team in ensuring their data is 'always on'.

Bobby defines leadership as motivating others towards achieving a common goal. He took us through some historical leaders to demonstrate that good leaders can have bad goals, and bad leaders can have good goals. Of course good leaders having good goals is what we want, but here are a few examples Bobby mentioned. Washington, Jackson, Lincoln are some political leaders. Bobby went on to highlight leaders like Al Capone (a good leader with bad goals), Hitler also falls into this category. Bobby sees the traits of a good leader as the following. Good follower, Servant Attitude, Cares for others, character and humility.



It's a matter of opinion if you think Microsoft are leading or following with the introduction of Windows 8 this month. Windows 8 is not really creating a frenzy of anticipation; there isn't likely to be any lines at a Microsoft store overnight waiting for this software. In fact if you are a

member of Technet, you have had access to the Final version of Windows 8 since August this year.

Will Windows 8 (Desktop) and Windows RT (Tablet) succeed? When the iPad was first announced the reviews were very mixed, jokes about the name and the fact it was just a big iPod were some of the popular knockdowns, however the product has gone on to not only be successful but define a whole new computing platform. Bill Gates has attempted tablets several times before and never met with much success, is this the right version? Now that same interface comes to tablets and desktop computers.

My crystal ball sees good things ahead for a Windows RT tablet device, but who will buy Windows 8 for a laptop or desktop computer without a touch interface? Businesses typically shy away from radical changes in interface because of the training costs and learning curves. Home users maybe more willing to give it a go, but the interface really suits a tablet or smart phone, not so much a desktop computer. I believe the future for a desktop computer is not that great regardless of the operating system 7 or 8. I believe Windows 8 will struggle to gain acceptance. It maybe technically brilliant, but will it be adopted on conventional hardware devices?

The tablet market will get interesting I believe. With Jelly Bean on Android and RT on tablets Apple are facing some stiff competition. We live in interesting times.

The 25 worst passwords of 2012, and easy ways to avoid them

Bad passwords never die -- in fact, they don't even fade away.

SplashData just released its annual list of the most common passwords stolen and posted by hackers, and if the list has a familiar look, it's because most of the same passwords have appeared on past lists. In fact, this year's top three -- "password," "123456," and "12345678" -- also finished one-two-three on SplashData's 2011 list.

The passwords below are not only the most common, they are also virtually useless at protecting an account. They're likely the first passwords a hacker would try when breaking in. As SplashData noted in announcing the list, "Users of any of these passwords are the most likely to be victims in future breaches."

The 2012 list, drawn from millions posted online, compared with where each password stood on the 2011 list:

Maintaining a set of strong passwords for network systems and websites is a pain for users, but SplashData recommends a few ways to make it easier, such as mixing in different types of characters and even using simple, easily remembered phrases separated by spaces, underscores or other characters. Two examples: "eat cake at 8!" and "car_park_city?"

Password management applications also can help users keep track of their passwords and avoid using the same password for multiple sites, which is another bad practice, especially when mixing, say, entertainment and social networking sites with financial services, SplashData said.

One other trick: If you use a password that appears on the list, change it.
