IT Career Journey

Cy Fenton, President of Booksamillion.com and SVP and CIO of Books-A-Million, Inc.

In the Information Technology field, we often start our careers as a Programmer or Network Administrator, move to Systems Analysts, to Systems or Programming Manager, and then on to Director. Very few move up to VP or CIO. Our October speaker has a different background and career moves. Our speaker is Cy Fenton who is presently President of Booksamillion.com and SVP and CIO of Books-A-Million, Inc.

Cy Fenton graduated with a BA degree in 1988 from Northwestern University. He founded TechHead Solutions in 1989 to do computer consulting for producers and musicians in the studios of Nashville. He sold TechHead Solutions in 1999. Cy and a partner started an Internet Marketing consulting group in 1994 named NetCentral, Inc. Cy was the EVP, Operations. NetCentral, Inc. was sold to Books-A-Million in 1999.

In 2001, Cy became VP, Store Technology for Books-A-Million. He then became SVP and CIO for Books-A-Million, Inc. in 2007, a position he still holds. In 2011, Cy also became President, Booksamillion.com where he is responsible for all digital sales and operations for Books-A-Million, Inc.

Cy will tell us how and why he got to where he is after a BA from college. He should be able to tell us what factors influenced his career decisions and how they might relate to us.

Cy is also a founding member of the National Retail Federation's IT Security Council (ITSC). He serves as its chairman and leads the executive committee. Cybersecurity has become top-most of importance for many retail organizations. The Target

Company incident got everyone's attention. Cy will give us a brief status report on retail security and even explain "spear-phishing." Keeping up with cybersecurity is important for all of us.
