Virtue-Based Leadership

Dr. Daniel L. LeBreton, Corporate Psychologist and Consultant at Peter Rock Consulting, Inc.

The majority of AITP members are leaders, either formal or informal. The right kind of leadership contributes to excellent results and to an engaging work environment. Our September speaker will discuss how to lead in ways that inspire people, contribute to the health and happiness of employees, and ultimately contribute to the long-term success of organizations. This subject is very germane at this time with the public comments about the IT industry not being good for people.

Our speaker is Dr. Daniel L. LeBreton who is a corporate psychologist and consultant at Peter Rock Consulting, Inc. (PRC). Dan has spent the past ten years providing leadership assessment, leadership development, and executive coaching services to organizations ranging from small non-profits to Fortune 500 companies.
