Service-Oriented-Architecture is an infrastructure that relies on Middleware. SOA is an idea, not a technology. It is boundless in scope and promises both unlimited software reuse and the interconnections of everything. Middleware is the connective tissue that binds together different applications. It "wraps" existing applications into service components in a way that lets them share data across a truly heterogeneous environment.

Our June program is a presentation titled: "Delivering Greater Business Integration with Service-Oriented-Architecture". Our speaker will discuss the imperatives and integration challenges facing today's developers, IT projects and CIO's. He will discuss how Middleware enables SOA and helps ease the pain in developing applications from a component based approach.

Normally, programmers write software based on a set of well-defined requirements. SOA demands that organizations create an ecosystem of service that may ultimately have an army of stakeholders inside and outside the firewall. The initial challenge of SOA is knowing where and how to start - where to draw a box

around a fixed set of requirements and how to build services that will yield tangible ROI.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Our May speaker, Ned Ramage, told us about the tenuous nature of personal privacy. Defining privacy as "the right to be left alone," he pointed out there is no legal structure for privacy in the U. S. We routinely give up personal information to banks, airlines and other entities with centralized databases. Our movements can be recorded by security cameras. In effect, we have electronic identities, possibly multiple identities. And with no power to find out how we are portrayed. Ned identifies these needs: Dialogue, Transparency & Accountability, Require need for info, and a Time Limit for keeping the information before it is destroyed. Transparency is better in the long run - if everyone can see everything and not just "authorities."

IT people have a say in decisions about privacy, but ultimately it is a management problem.

I was in Target one day last week and discovered they'd put some of their dollar DVDs on sale for 25 cents each. One treasure I bought was a twin film noir set which contained "Whistle Stop" with George Raft and Ava Gardner and "Detour" with Tom Neal and Ann Savage. The first movie had the expected performances from Raft and Gardner to recommend it, although the motivations and behavior of the characters were sometimes bewildering. Plus, Victor McLaglen stealing the show. The second starred a

pair of actors I'd not heard of and had me scurrying to the Internet Movie Database after the viewing. This movie was rescued from decay as the first selected by a restoration project devoted to preserving neglected "B" classics. Ann Savage, who convincingly played the horrific Vera, didn't get very far in Hollywood and retired from the movies in the Fifties. Tom Neal had a somewhat more active career in the early fifties but saw it disappear after beating up another actor and later murdering his wife in 1965. He died months after his release from prison, his real life as much a film noir as the part he played.

May we all have better luck with our IT careers.
