### **PERSONAL PRIVACY**

Personal privacy is a subject that has become of much greater concern to all of us who use computers. Identity theft has become big business as large amounts of credit data have been stolen. Many of us wonder, will it happen to me, and what can I do about it?

Our May program is about the broad range of personal privacy. What can we look forward to and how can we protect ourselves?

Our speaker is Ned Ramage who has been active in computer security work for the last ten years. He works for the Journey Team/Micro Tech organization which is a professional consulting group providing computer security, accounting, management and support. He is active in the Computers Freedom and Privacy Conference and is creating a clearing-house for privacy information in Tennessee.

Ned will discuss a number of topics, including; Is there any guarantee to a right of privacy? Does technology protect us or expose us? Does privacy matter? Ned will also discuss Privacy vs. the First Amendment, the European Union's position vs. the US position, and is protecting privacy worth it?

A major portion of Ned's presentation will be on privacy and the future - RFID, identity theft, regulations, etc. He will answer any questions in the privacy area and tell us how we can both help ourselves and others in this area. Privacy is an issue that we should not ignore.

Ned Ramage started in computer work helping a music production company use their personal computers. Ned plays guitar and steel guitar and originally came to Nashville to be part of the music industry. He has been a consultant specializing in data networks and security for over 15 years. Ned holds the CISSP certification.

Ned has a Bachelor's degree from Earlham College in Indiana. He and his two teenage daughters live in the Hillsboro Village area where Ned still plays jazz guitar. They enjoy their 16' sailboat on Percy Priest Lake.

## MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

---

Carol Smock gave a talk on Networking at the last chapter meeting. The human kind of networking, that is. She defined this networking as a Sphere of Influence communications network -- interaction among people sharing information, ideas, and resources. This interaction takes the form of conversation, talking to people face-to-face. To get conversation going she recommends the FORD model: Family, Occupation, Recreation, Dreams. These are all safe subject matters. You want to find something in common with the person and a 5 to 10 minute conversation will determine if you want to take the interaction further. If so, you hand him your card and on his card you record a note to remind yourself which one he is (dog owner, musician, programmer, where we met). She recommends a handwritten note follow-up unless he expresses a preference for another method like e-mail.

From this beginning you build a relationship. You should gauge yourself to make sure it is not one-sided. It should be mutually beneficial. Here you focus on sharing ideas and resources. Think of others in the network while talking to the person. Think of ways to help the person you are meeting. Reconnect with people in the network. She says networking is not selling. It might lead to selling, but that is not the immediate purpose. She prefers to get to know someone before referring them to others. And once you start networking, she says, don't stop.

Donna Womack, chapter member from High-Tech Institute, joined us at the last board meeting to discuss upcoming student conferences, specifically the proposed national conference to be held in '08. That's right, the national. Donna believes Nashville will be in the running for the '08, given the changes which will allow contests to be held in the hotel rather than requiring host school facilities. Our regional conference last year drew 120 participants. The national conference this past month had 800 students and the next one in Dallas is expected to top 1000. The one after that is also spoken for, in Michigan. When it finally comes around here we might expect 1500 students. The national planners are said to be looking at Opryland Hotel to serve as a venue.

Closer to home, we still hope to put on a one-day student conference for our local affiliates soon. This would be held at the High-Tech Institute and feature contests to get our students comfortable with competing in the regionals and nationals. There would likely be informational sessions as well. Stay tuned.

### AITP BOARD MEETING SUMMARY

April 22, 2005

This meeting was held at the home of Paul Saunders.

1. The Treasurer's Report of income and expenses for 2005 was reviewed. We also had determined prior to April 15, 2005, that it was not necessary for our chapter to file an income tax return for 2004.
2. Frank asked for assistance in getting the number of attendees, including student members, professional members and guests, at the October 2004 Region 7 Student Conference. Gerald will provide him with this information.
3. Paul said he has speakers for the next few meetings, but he is always looking for good speakers. Anyone with suggestions should contact Paul.
4. The Region 7 Student Conference will be held in Birmingham, AL the third weekend in October 2005. All preparations are on track at this time.
5. Donna Womack attended the board meeting and discussed several topics:
  - She and several students attended the National Student Conference held in Atlanta earlier this month. There were some issues with start times, hardware problems, and competitions, but in all it was a good conference. There were lots of breakout sessions. The fee included contest entry (could enter as many as they wanted), attendance at all breakout sessions, breakfast, lunch, and the banquet. It was a very enjoyable trip.
  - High Tech Institute, where Donna is employed, is thinking of bidding on the 2008 National Student Conference. It is her understanding that her school would be responsible for setting up the gaming party, scavenger hunt, and providing volunteers for the event. They would like to know how we as the local professional chapter feel about this and what type support we would be able to provide. Paul made a motion, seconded by Frank, that the board endorse the High Tech Institute proposal to be host school for the 2008 National Student Conference. The board approved this motion. Donna will look into exactly what type effort the school and our chapter would require.
6. The board discussed the possibility of having a one-day conference at High Tech Institute this fall. A committee was formed to look into this in more detail and will report at the next board meeting.
7. The board discussed the possibility of hosting the 2006 Region 7 Student Conference in Nashville. Frank said another chapter had expressed interest in hosting the 2006 conference. He will get further information on the status of their request before any planning begins.
