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MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Tom Coffey of US LEC was our August speaker. He brought us up to date on developments in the telecommunications industry. Beginning with the mergers and regulatory environment he pointed out the benefits of the 1996 Reform Act:

1. Broke up the phone monopoly.
2. Created competition
3. Accelerated fiber deployment
4. Quality of service improved
5. Spurred investment and innovation (DSL released to public, etc.)

Things changed during the '02-'05 period. Regulations were changed to encourage a conceptually fruitless cable-wireless-wireline competition. Switched resale was eliminated. Generally the rules favored the recreation of the old Bell monopoly. All this resulted in little funding and little progress. Phone companies went from 2000 to 200 through bankruptcies.

The familiar time division multiplexing (TDM) used by the wireline phone service only uses 15% of capacity and is not effective for all types of content. IP is the great cost driver in that it uses all the bandwidth and allows for convergence of voice, video, and music content sources. TCP/IP is the most effective protocol. Some new technologies on the horizon include WiMax wireless transport and Intelligent Ethernet.

Tom is not fond of the merger mania -- MCI-Verizon, Sprint-Nextel, etc. because new technologies come from competition and encouraged his audience to contact their congresspersons to take an interest in the DOJ and FCC investigations.

His company US LEC has 24000 customers, 800 in Nashville, an ATM network in 26 cities, and no layoffs, closed offices, or abandoned customers, with a 99% customer retention.

Like many people during the summer I just took a vacation. When Hurricane Ivan trashed the time-share in Gulf Shores we lost our week in February, and the resort company which will build a new high-rise in its place offered a replacement week. Most of their property is in the Branson, Missouri area. So we headed off to the Ozarks for the first time. Branson has become justly famous for its live shows featuring performances of country classics, often by the original stars who made them famous. But if you don't care for the shows there are many scenic attractions in the area. Views of the hills, and my favorites, restaurants like Shorty Small's, Danna's, and Zoey's. I'm not big on amusement parks, but Silver City and Celebration City should fill the bill of any aficionado. And they have a Ride the Ducks attraction like the one in Chattanooga.

Just don't take any route that has Highway 160 in it unless you enjoy hours of winding road. You will have it pretty much to yourself, however.

Meeting Management

No Board meeting was held this month, so we are providing some helpful tips on meeting management courtesy of Paul Saunders.

Meeting Management

We all attend too many meetings. Some meetings are more productive than others. The following points on meeting management are not new but should be reviewed every once in a while. Suggestion: Make a copy of this and attach it to the agenda for your next meeting.

1. Explore alternatives to meeting—conference call, FAX, E-Mail, correspondence, etc.
2. Limit attendance to only those involved in a project/assignment.
3. Keep the participants to a minimum.
4. Choose an appropriate time. (Late meetings are usually the least productive.)
5. Choose an appropriate place/environment.
6. Define the purpose clearly in your own mind before calling the meeting.
7. Distribute the agenda in advance and give fair notice (2-4 days in advance).
8. Time-limit the meeting and the agenda.
9. Start on time.
10. Assign minutes-taking responsibilities.
11. Hold a stand-up meeting if appropriate.
12. Start and stick to the agenda.
13. Control Interruptions—allow only for emergencies.
14. Accomplish your purpose—make assignments or obtain approvals/agreements.
15. Restate conclusions and assignments to be carried forward, at the closing of the meeting.
16. End on time.
17. Expedite the preparation and distribution of the minutes.
