

CONTEST SUMMARY

PC Troubleshooting

The preliminary contest will take the form of a written exam testing students general PC knowledge. Teams with the highest scores will advance to the final round where they will be given a broken PC to be repaired during the specified interval.

Web Design

Students will be required to develop a corporate website with an emphasis on a form and data retrieval from a database. Upon completion, students will submit their URL to the contest proctor. Available applications are: Microsoft Office, DreamWeaver, and PHP/MYSQL.

Network Design

Students will use MS Office including Visio to create a proposal for a corporate network design based on a problem statement scenario. Elements will include LAN design, network components, protocols used, security issues, network architecture, and a budget.

Database Design

Contestants will be given a problem statement and be required to design and implement a database using MS Access. Teams will be required to design an ER diagram and a user friendly database application to address the problem statement.

Graphic Design

Students will create a company Web site with an emphasis on ease of navigation and effective visual communication. A logo, homepage, and at least two other pages will be required. Available applications will include MS Office, DreamWeaver, Photoshop CS, Illustrator CS, and Flash.

.Net Programming

Contestants will be given a problem statement and be required to design and implement a solution using any set of .Net applications of their choice. The .Net applications available at the contest site will be open source software.
